I am an experienced mediator and arbitrator of international business disputes in a variety of subject and geographic areas. I've rendered dozens of awards in London and New York and mediated many cases in New York and by video.

I was Deputy General Counsel of BGC Partners, Inc., a NASDAQ listed company. Also headed dispute resolution globally for its affiliate Cantor Fitzgerald. Both are global financial services companies. They are both involved in international trade and finance others in the field. In 2007 their Chairman recruited me as Deputy General Counsel (after 15 years as one of its principal outside counsel).

My in-house responsibilities were broad based, geographically and in areas of law. From 2008-12 about 120 days of each year I was in London. I also spent time in Brazil and Hong Kong in connection with legal affairs. I managed litigation, arbitration, mediation, employment and other matters in the U.K., France, Brazil, Hong Kong, Philippines, Singapore, Australia, Canada, Japan and several other countries. In some matters the opposing party was private, in others governmental. In-house litigators, employment and patent lawyers reported to me. I had broad based engagement with contract, deal, tax, securities, compliance, general IP and other lawyers. I led the lawyering for an acquisition in Brazil and negotiated and reviewed many contracts with suppliers and customers globally.

I was a general commercial litigator for over 30 years. My representation included two countries and also opposed governments and related entities. While at law firms I participated (usually as lead) in about 50 mediations and about 20 arbitrations (to award). In court I litigated about 15 cases to judgment and argued about 30 appeals, many with reported decisions. Intellectual property of most types, contract, securities, business and other torts, compliance, regulatory and statutory matters, workouts, bankruptcy and creditors' rights, real estate and employment fell within cases handled.

I am a <u>Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, Secretary of the NY Branch</u>, have its Diploma in International Arbitration. Am also a <u>Center for Efficient Dispute Resolution Accredited Mediator</u>. The <u>American Arbitration Association</u>, the <u>International Institute for Conflict Prevention and Resolution</u>, the World Intellectual Property Organization, the <u>Court of Arbitration for Art</u>, and <u>American Intellectual</u> <u>Property Law Association</u> list me both on arbitration and mediation panels in several areas, including general commercial, finance related, intellectual property and employment.
